Principal

For the past twenty-seven years Fayette County High School has been supervised by Mr. John Morgan Brown who is very competent and pleasant.

Mr. Brown was born at Kelleyton, Alabama. Since his father owned a farm, a grist mill, a sawmill, and a gin, he soon learned the meaning of work. His strong beliefs about the value of industriousness were instilled early in life.

Putting these beliefs into practice, he later enrolled at the Alabama Polytechnic Institute and began to study Chemical Engineering. Four years later he graduated and was offered a teaching job. He accepted with the intention of this being a temporary arrangement until further plans could be made.

As time passed, he became aware of the challenge of teaching and of its many rewards, so he chose teaching for his life's work. For four years he taught at Guin, then three years at Fayette County High School, after which he served as principal of Vernon High School for three years. In 1930 he became principal of Fayette County High School where he has been for twenty-seven years. During this time he did not neglect his own education. After attending summer school at Auburn and the University of Alabama, he received his Master of Arts degree in 1938.

Mr. Brown is a successful man who is loved and respected. He is very efficient in handling business matters and in understanding student problems. The senior class of 1958 wishes to congratulate him and to express appreciation for all he has done.

Charles Hendrix, Richard Tucker, Ronald Morrison, Ned Newton, Melvin Howard, Danny Propst, and Derrell Estes were on the basketball team. Charlotte Kemp ran for Homecoming Queen. Mary Alice Loftis and John Williamson were Campus King and Queen. Frances Finley and Derrell Estes won second place in the beauty contest. Other contestants were Peggy Dodson, Jerry Mitchell, Melvin Howard, Gwen White, Ronald Morrison, and Lomax Green. Danny Propst, Frances Finley, and Frances Sims were in the Hall of Fame. LaNelle Johnson won the school oratorical contest and Frances Sims was third. The other finalists were Lynn Smith, Dorothy Stephens, Frances Finley, Gwen White, Dorothy Taylor, and Janice Dickinson. Majorettes were Gwen White, Edrena Caudle, and Ann Stripling. Our president was Ed Godfrey.

When we finally became Seniors, the class had diminished to 70. Mr. Kirkley and Mrs. Colburn are our homeroom teachers. Our officers are: President, Melvin Howard; Vice-President, Danny Propst; Secretary, Judy Langston; Treasurer, Frances Finley; Reporter, Bill Robertson; Parliamentarian, Stephen Smith; Sergeant-at-Arms, Lomax Green; Lawyer, Ned Newton; Prophet, Charles Hendrix; Poet, Dorothy Taylor; Musician, Charlotte Kemp; Statistician, Edrena Caudle, Giftorian, Ed Godfrey; and Historian, Janice Dickinson.

The football captains were Danny Propst and Lomax Green. Other Seniors on the team are Jimmy Hubbert, Ed Godfrey, Robert Merritt, James Meherg, Harold Fowler, and Derrell Estes. Danny Propst won the Tiger Rag Award and the Ushers Club Award for the most outstanding football player.

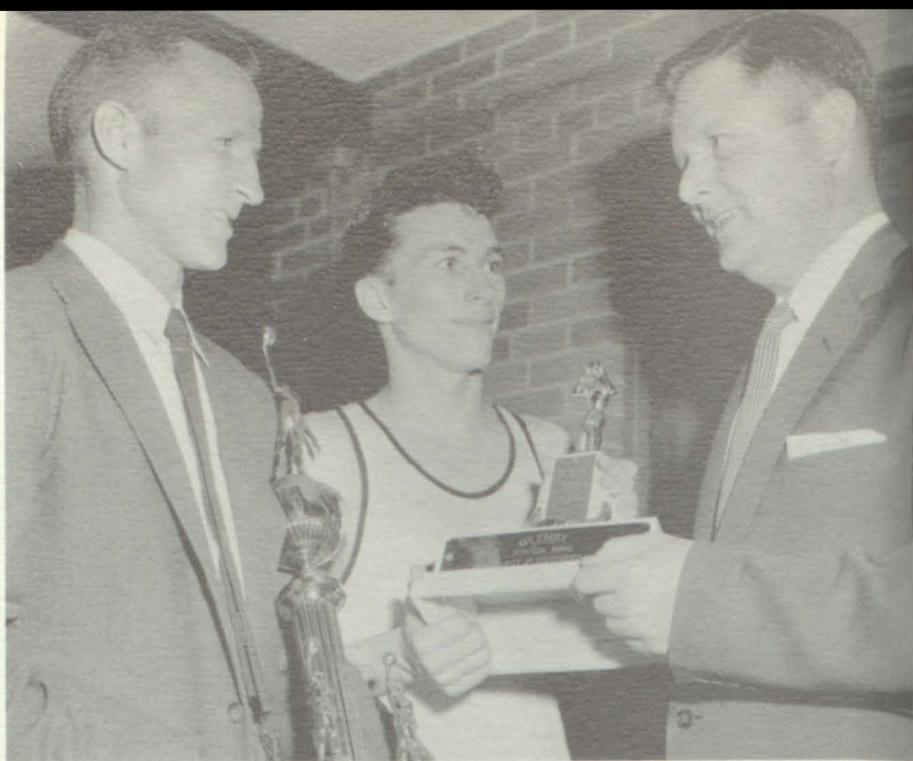
Derrell Estes 'Most Valuable'

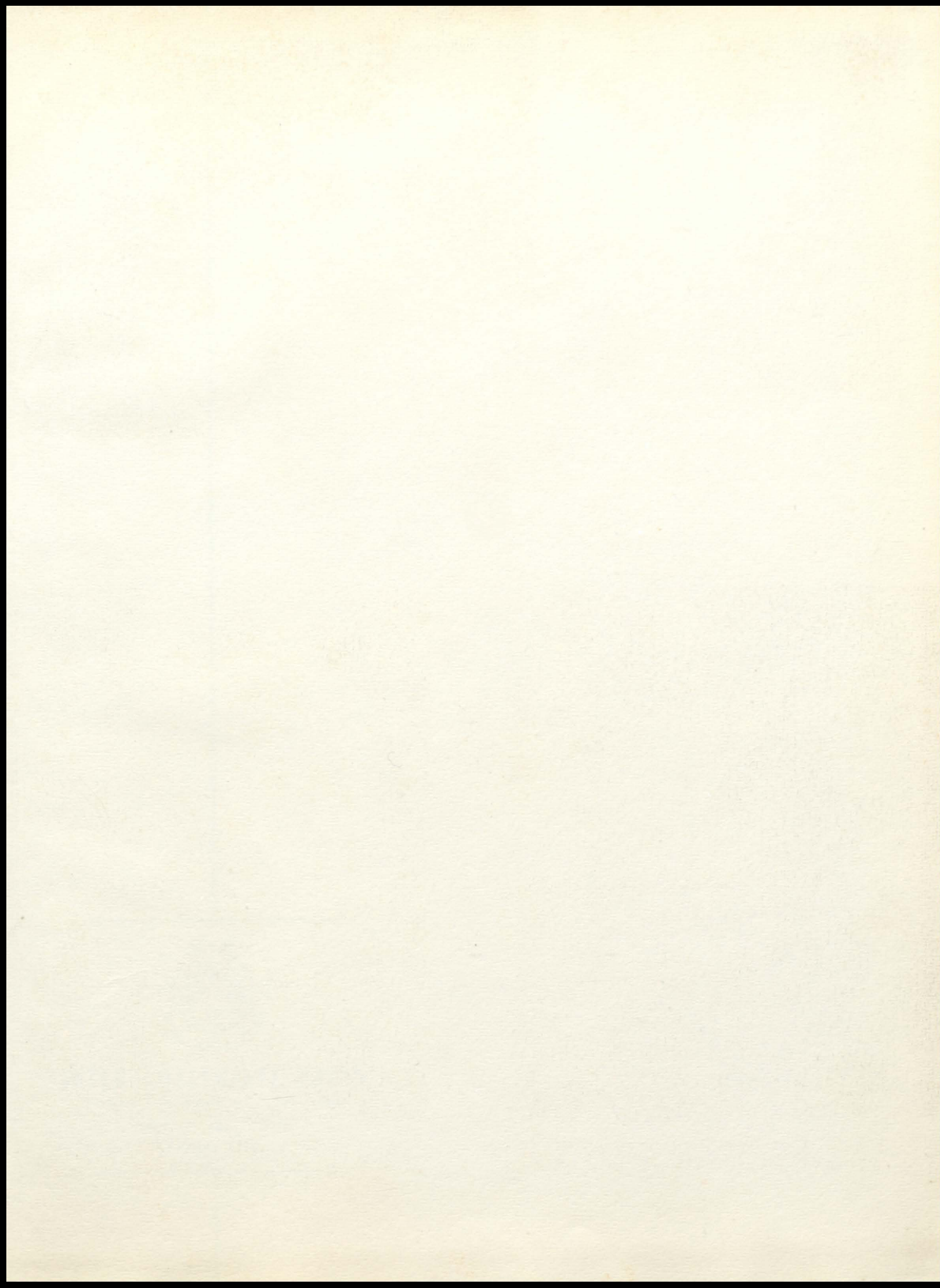


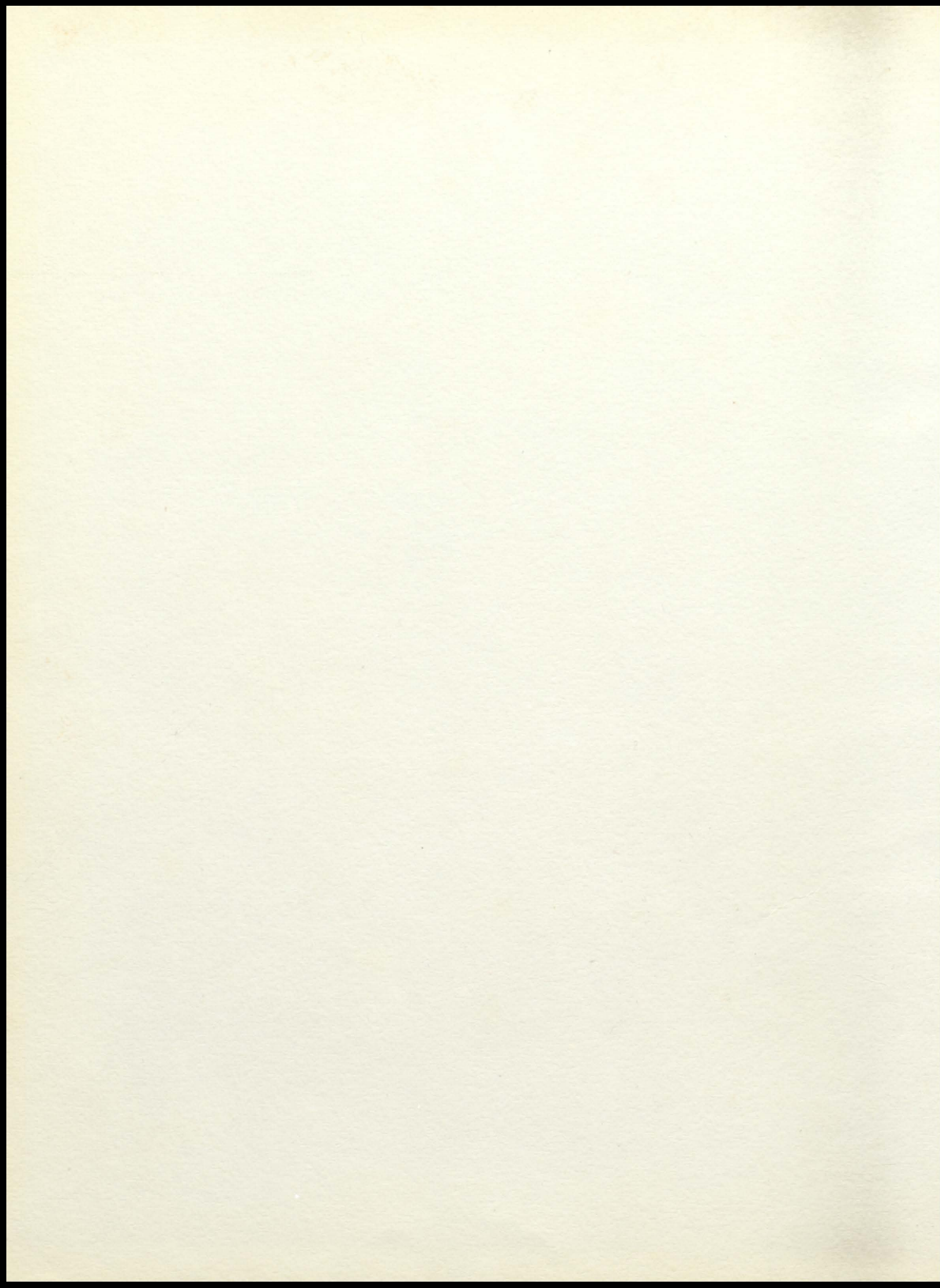
